THE PROJECT

CULTURAD is a European project implemented by 6 partners from 4 European countries (Spain, Italy, Cyprus and Greece) focused on “enhancing European cultural and creative practices to empower civic engagement and address the risk of radicalisation among youth”



OBJECTIVES

- Enhance civic engagement and address the risk of radicalisation among marginalised youth through European arts and cultural practices
- Increase cross sectoral and transnational cooperation for knowledge exchange and peer mentoring on youth engagement and prevention of radicalisation between youth practitioners and professionals in the arts and culture sector
- Adopt a youth-led participatory approach through co-creation methods

ACTIVITIES

- Development of a training course and open resource toolbox on European arts and culture to increase civic engagement and lower radicalization risks
- Development of the online CULTURAD platform
- Capacity building of youth practitioners and CCS professionals on the CULTURAD Training Package and workshops with marginalized youth
- Virtual transnational roundtables with stakeholders, for the co-creation of the Practice & Policy Recommendations Guide

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3rd TRANSNATIONAL PROJECT MEETING

CULTURAD partners met in Bilbao on 23rd October 2024, at the facilities of the University of País Vasco (UPV) in the Bizkaia Aretoa. They went through all the project results, discussed follow-up actions and prepared for the Final Conference.



ACHIEVED MILESTONES:

- Establishment of a multi-national User-Scrutiny panel consisting of 25 youth practitioners, Creative Cultural Sector professionals and youth;
- Realisation of alignment workshops in each country with youth practitioners and CCS professionals for co-designing the CULTURAD Training Package;
- A 'train the trainers' online workshop for youth practitioners, CCS professionals and youth;

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Final Conference

The **Final Conference** of the **CULTURAD** project took place on 24th October in the Faculty of Education Sciences of UPV (Bilbao, Spain). During the event, the partner organisations presented the activities developed during the 2 years the project lasted. The local theatre Zenbatu performed "Under the Bridge" to close the event.



ACHIEVED MILESTONES:

- Training sessions in each partner country for capacity building of youth education professionals and subsequent workshops with more than 100 young people across the consortium;
- 2 virtual round tables with the participation of more than 40 professionals from the youth sector, civil society organizations and young people from several European and non-European countries;
- Local awareness actions in 4 countries, reaching more than 200 people from the local communities;
